Darb1718 is pleased to present the second edition of Something Else OFF Biennale Cairo which will run from 1st November until 16th December 2018. OBC is a large scale international contemporary visual arts exhibition, which was initially designed to run parallel to the official Cairo Biennale. However, due to the recurrent cancellations of the state run biennale, OBC is now organized independently.

The current edition that is titled "What if it did not happen!" showcases works by more then 90 artists. It is directed and coordinated by **Moataz Nasr** and **Simon Njami** and it also includes exhibitions by 6 international curators: **Elena Abbiatici** (IT); **Power Ekroth** (Sweden); **Valentina Gioia Levy** (IT); **Sara Oberrauch** (Germany); **Henry Woo** (Hong Kong); **Sheila Zago** (Brazil).

Italian curator Valentina Gioia Levy is presenting the group show "Untold Stories' Manifesto" that will display works in form of posters by: **Stefano Cagol** (Italy); **CoCa Collective** - (Sri Lanka); **Dalila Dalleas** (Algeria); **Edgar Endress** (Chile); **Izumi Chiaraluce** (JP/IT); **Cesar Meneghetti** (Brasil); **Peter Puype** (Belgium); **Valerié Oka** (Ivory Coast); **Yoko Ono** (JP/USA); **Marco Raparelli** (Italy); **Reena Saini Kallat** (India); **Tomasz Wendland** (Poland)

The project aims to explore stories and individual narratives as a part of the History. The curator invited the artists to broke the silence and bring back the unsaid to the table of discussion, offering a framework for questioning an encompassing idea of History, which would be ideally made by the losers' narratives and by common people's stories and by all those facts that have been silenced and never told before. What do we know about History? We know that History is the study of events that took place in the past, a succession of facts, which some academics and experts called 'historians' have attentively collected, gathered together and arranged according to chronological

order. We know that we can 'trust' History and that we should learn from it how to not repeat the same errors that we did in the past so that we will be able to construct a better future. That being said, the only thing that we effectively get from history is that it seems condemned to repeat itself.

Why are we keeping making the same errors again and again? Why are we learning nothing from history? Why this is still happening?

If we got nothing from history isn't it because we are looking at it always from the same perspective? Isn't it time to look at history from different points of views instead of looking at it only from the same side, that is the winners' side because, as the British statesman Winston Churchill once said: "History is always written by the victors"

The dominant classes have always shaped history and produced official narratives which are generally taken for granted, but this doesn't imply that all the unofficial narratives and all the silenced stories are lost forever. Despite the attempts of erasure, the untold stories often find a way to resurface and even if they don't, they still can produce effects. In fact, as the French philosopher Jean Paul Sartre once said, "Every word has consequences. Every silence, too."

All the participating artists sent a different contribution (drawings, comic stripes, photographs, poems or brief statements) which tells a story, a personal feeling or opinion that they think would deserve attention.

The show will present a new participatory project by internationally acclaimed artist **Yoko Ono** that she specifically created for this event "Write your untold story". The work consists of a series of blanks posters that will be hanged in Darb1718 and around Il Cairo. People will be encouraged to give their contributions giving voices to their silenced stories.

The exhibition will also includes a selection of works by the Italian artist **Valeria Costa** (1912 - 2003) that in the '80s realized a series of paintings and drawings inspired by middle east conflicts, the oil crisis and the Italian foreign policy in the area which, during those years, has been often described as 'pro-Arabs'. The selection embodies three canvases of the series the *Women's Burden* and some drawings on paper which have never been exhibited outside of Italy.

Moreover, the show includes three special projects: a workshop and a collaborative installation by **Lisa Batacchi** and two performances by Indian artist **Manohar Chiluveru** and the French duo Hantu composed by **Pascale Weber** and **Jean Delsaux**.
